A "GOLDEN" OPPORTUNITY

The story I am going to relate to you is true—only the names have been omitted because the generous donor does not want his name to be mentioned. It is an account of a most unusual way the Lord chose to supply a need for one of our missionaries, and how one person listened to the Lord about that need, and how the Lord provided in a most unusual way.

In the January *News and Reports*, in his monthly letter, Jud Hatcher shared a prayer request regarding a pressing need: "We humbly reach out to you, our faithful supporters, with a pressing need: to purchase a car. Would you be willing to give for this urgent need? Due to the increasing demand and rising expenditures on transportation, we urgently need to acquire this vehicle. The estimated cost for this much needed resource is \$10,000. As we step into the new month, we ask for your continued prayers and support. The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Let's continue partnering in this kingdom work."

Well, in Jud's July report, he listed several requests for prayer—first on the list was "the purchase of a car." For seven months, nothing had been done to supply the need. An elderly gentleman in our church (Calvary Baptist Church in Hurricane, WV) had asked me several weeks before the July report if the need that Jud had shared had been met. When he learned that it had not, I found that the need had been weighing heavily on his heart. He had expected to receive some money from a source that he had hoped to use to help with the need, but it had not come through as expected.

Let me jump ahead to Monday, July 22. I received a call from this dear brother saying that he had been "looking around in a drawer and found over \$10,000 in gold!" He and his wife were going to a broker to get cash for the gold to buy the needed car for the Hatchers. He asked if I would meet them at the bank the following day to make sure that the bank draft was properly made out, and would I send it on for Jud? You can imagine the skepticism of the banker at first—here was an elderly couple who had come in wanting to send a large amount of money to someone in a foreign country—a fairly common scam these days. Fortunately, I was able to verify that, as a member of the pastoral staff at Calvary and member of the board of directors of BFM, I could validate the need and have known the missionary personally for many years. On July 23, I was blessed to be able to post a certified letter containing the funds for the Hatchers to our treasurer, George Sledd, to be sent to the Hatchers. God does, indeed, work in strange and mysterious ways to fulfill His purposes.

Perhaps this account may challenge many of us regarding helping meet the special needs of our missionaries. The Apostle Paul wrote in II Corinthians 8:1-5, "Moreover, brethren, we make known to you the grace of God on the churches of Macedonia; that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality. For I bear witness that according to their ability, yes, and beyond their ability, they were freely willing, imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of ministering to the saints. And not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God."

Julio is one of our missionary volunteers who travels with Projeto Vida, our evangelistic travel team. Julio is a quiet man, usually not speaking unless spoken to. This changes, though, when he gets a chance to talk about Jesus. Recently, after our drama team performed some gospel skits in a public school, Julio was talking one-on-one with a teenaged boy. In just a few seconds, a whole group of the boy's friends circled around to listen to what they were talking about. Julio saw the opportunity and sensed that the Lord was leading him to share with them all what Christ had done for them. He presented the gospel clearly and persuasively for several minutes. When he finished, he asked the whole group if any of them was willing to surrender their life to Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. Fourteen teenagers' hand shot up and they each confessed Christ as Lord right there in the school gymnasium! I am so thankful to have a part in Projeto Vida's ministry and for young men like Julio for the boldness and spiritual insight to follow the Lord's leading in presenting the gospel.

Pastor Cledson continues to lead the church in Curitiba in growth and outreach ministries. He has shown tremendous wisdom and awareness of God's leading through some tough trials. There was an influential young man in his church who attempted to lead several other youth in an erroneous direction doctrinally, but Pastor Cledson was able to exhort the youth group as a whole using the Scriptures to show the fallacy the young man was trying to spread. 

July 2, 2024 Dear Brethren,

It has been a long time since I reported to you. News I have a plenty, but I have not stopped long enough to report it to you.

After the long trip to Peru and the big flood it was time to go back up the Moa River to finish some work on the building at the mountains. I had intended to go in my boat, but the bottom dropped out of the river and I had to get our itinerant missionary, Geverton, to take me in his canoe. It took us 12 hours as opposed to 5 hours, but it was pretty nice to have somebody else at the helm for a change. I loaded up the little Honda generator and a bunch of power tools and in 3 days was able to finish up the windows in the front of the

building. We also held services with the congregation there.

Shortly after that we had the huge privilege to have Pastor Mark Pyles and wife Valarie with us for a far too short visit. We were able to let them get a little sample of what the Lord is doing here in Cruzeiro do Sul. Perhaps the neatest thing we were able to do was visit our work at Gama. We all
